Writing Task 2 – Discussion Essay

Topic:

Should governments limit the use of artificial intelligence?

Write a discussion essay.

Include:

- arguments in favour
- arguments against
- possible consequences
- your own conclusion

Length: 500 words

Writing Task 3 – Newspaper Article

Situation:

Your town wants to introduce a four-day school week.

Write a newspaper article for a local newspaper discussing:

- the proposed change
- possible benefits
- possible drawbacks
- reactions from students and teachers

Use an engaging headline and a formal journalistic style.

Length: 450–550 words

Writing Task 4 – Motivational Letter

Situation:

You are applying for an international youth conference on climate change.

Write a motivational letter explaining:

- why you want to participate
- your interests and experience
- what you would contribute
- how the programme would benefit you

Length: 350–450 words

Writing Task 5 – Speech

Topic:

"Why young people should vote."

Imagine you have been asked to speak at your school's democracy day.

Write a persuasive speech.

Remember to:

- address the audience directly
- use rhetorical devices

- include examples
- end with a strong call to action

Length: 500 words

Writing Task 6 – Formal Email

Situation:

Your school plans to replace printed textbooks with digital devices.

Write an email to the headteacher expressing your opinion.

Include:

- advantages
- disadvantages
- suggestions for implementation
- a polite conclusion

Length: 300–400 words

Writing Task 7 – Report

Situation:

Your school has asked students to investigate how technology affects learning.

Write a report including:

- introduction
- findings
- analysis
- recommendations

Use headings and a formal register.

Length: 450 words

Writing Task 8 – Short Story

Opening sentence:

Requirements:

- satisfying ending

Length: 600 words

Writing Task 9 – Inner Monologue

Situation:

Write the character's inner monologue immediately afterwards.

Show:

- emotions
- fears
- memories
- future decisions

Length: 450 words

Writing Task 10 – Opinion Essay

Topic:

"Should universities remain free of charge?"

Write an opinion essay.

Discuss:

- equal opportunities
- economic consequences
- responsibility of the government
- your own opinion

Support your ideas with convincing arguments and examples.

Length: 500 words
