### If Sentences (Conditional Sentences)

We use **if sentences** to talk about possible, imaginary, or impossible situations.

Type	Form	Use	Example
Type 1	If + Present Simple, <b>will + infinitive</b>	Real or possible future situations	If it rains, I will stay at home.
Type 2	If + Past Simple, <b>would + infinitive</b>	Unreal or unlikely situations now or in the future	If I had more money, I would travel the world.
Type 3	If + Past Perfect, <b>would have + past participle</b>	Imaginary situations in the past (too late to change)	If she had studied, she would have passed the test.
