🛊 Irregular Verbs (Unregelmäßige Verben) – Erklärung

1. Was sind unregelmäßige Verben?

Unregelmäßige Verben **ändern ihre Form** im **Simple Past** (Vergangenheit) und/oder im **Past Participle** (3. Form) **nicht nach einem festen Muster**.

• Anders als regelmäßige Verben, die einfach -ed im Simple Past bekommen (z. B. play → played), haben unregelmäßige Verben eigene Formen.

2. Warum muss man sie lernen?

Unregelmäßige Verben werden häufig im Alltag verwendet:

- Beispiele: go, see, eat, have, take, write
- Sie erscheinen in Simple Past und Present Perfect

3. Bildung

Zeitform	Bildung	Beispiel
Simple Past	eigene Form	$go \rightarrow went, see \rightarrow saw$
Past Participle	eigene Form	$go \rightarrow gone, see \rightarrow seen$

Merksatz:

- Present Perfect = have/has + Past Participle
- Simple Past = eigene Vergangenheitsform

4. Beispiele im Satz

Simple Past

- I went to school yesterday.
- She saw a movie last night.
- They ate pizza yesterday.

Present Perfect

• I have **gone** to London three times.

- She has **seen** that movie before.
- They have eaten all the cookies.
